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Bienvenue à Arles!

Located in sunny Southern France, **Arles** is a vibrant Provençal city where history, art, and nature come together to create an unforgettable cultural experience. Located in the **Bouches-du-Rhône department** in the **Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur** region, Arles sits at the crossroads of the Rhône River and the edge of the wild Camargue Natural Park, just a short drive from the Mediterranean sea.



This UNESCO World Heritage city, once a key outpost of the Roman Empire, is home to **remarkably well-preserved Roman monuments**, winding medieval streets, bustling open-air markets, and a rich artistic legacy – including the iconic works of **Vincent van Gogh**, who painted some of his most famous masterpieces here. Whether you're enjoying a glass of rosé on a shaded terrace, exploring Roman amphitheatres, or watching pink flamingos take flight over salt

marshes, Arles offers the perfect setting to **immerse yourself in French language and culture**.

One of the great pleasures of life in Arles is the **local cuisine**. Rooted in Mediterranean tradition and Provençal flavors, the food here is simple, fresh, and full of character. From **bull meat stews (gardiane de taureau)** and **olive tapenade** to freshly caught fish and goat's cheese drizzled with lavender honey, every meal is a celebration of local produce and culinary heritage. Don't miss the lively weekly markets, where you can taste seasonal delicacies and practice your French with local vendors.

With its warm climate, **dynamic arts scene**, and vibrant community, Arles is more than a place to learn French – it's a place to live it. Our immersive French language programme invites you to experience everyday life *à la provençale*, in a city that is as inspiring as it is authentic.

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Course structure

Our week-long **intermediate language and culture program** is designed to provide you with **practical skills** that can be immediately applied in **daily life**. Over the course of the first four days, you will attend **dynamic and interactive French language classes**, held both inside and outside of the classroom. These lessons focus on **real-world communication**, helping you to build the confidence to speak French with locals. We'll concentrate on oral skills—**speaking and understanding**—so you can feel more comfortable engaging in conversations. This course is designed for **intermediate learners** who have already gained a basic grasp of the language and who would like to improve their language skills and fluency. All participants



will have a short exchange with a member of our team prior to the course to ensure that they are able to meet the pre-requisite level for the course.

What sets our course apart is the **unique combination of indoor and outdoor learning**. While our language classes are **engaging and practical**, we take the learning beyond the classroom. You'll have the opportunity to use French in **real-life settings**, interacting with locals and practicing the language in the vibrant streets of Arles, cafes, markets, and other public spaces.

After all, the best classroom is the world outside!

Each week's theme ties into your experience, and for this particular course, the focus is on **"art, cuisine et histoire"**. You'll learn **vocabulary and expressions** to talk about - and also listen to others talking about - artists inspired by Arles and the surrounding area as well as local dishes and the rich local cultural heritage of this beautiful Provençal town.

We maintain a **small group size**—no more than 8 people—ensuring that each learner receives plenty of individual attention and valuable practice. This allows for more meaningful exchanges and tailored learning experiences.

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In the afternoons (*or mornings, depending on final schedule*), you'll enjoy **outings** that complement your language lessons. These may include **cooking workshops**, where you'll not only discover local culinary traditions but also practice your French in a relaxed, enjoyable setting. You'll also **visit nearby museums, monuments and art foundations** in Arles, while engaging in conversation in French to maximize immersion.

A Wednesday highlight will be a trip to the **local market**, where you'll get to sample fresh produce, chat with vendors, and learn more about the regional specialties.

Lunchtime is an opportunity for further language practice during our "language lunch" excursions. You'll visit different local restaurants, enjoying traditional Provençal meals while continuing to converse in French with fellow participants and your teachers.

On Friday, we'll do a **full-day excursion** by train to **Avignon**, visiting the historical **Palais des Papes** and other museums / sites. We'll also enjoy a "language lunch" together in an Avignon restaurant.



Evenings are free for you to explore the town at your own pace. Whether you decide to wander through the charming streets of Arles, relax with a glass of wine at a local bar, or simply enjoy the serene atmosphere, the evening is yours to enjoy.

By the end of the week, you'll not only have improved your French but also gained a deeper appreciation for the local culture, cuisine, and way of life. The course is designed to help you feel more confident and comfortable using French in real-world situations, all while enjoying the beauty and history of Arles.

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Prices + practical information

- **Full week immersion** (including 30+ hours of French practice "inside" + "outside", daily restaurant "conversation lunches" and a day excursion) : **700€**
- **1-day immersion** (6h of French / day, daily restaurant "conversation lunches") : **150€ / day**
- **Half-day immersion + lunch** (4h30 of French / day, restaurant "conversation lunch") : **120€ / ½ day + lunch**
- **Half-day immersion** (3h of French / day) : **80€ / ½ day**

The "full week immersion" includes:

- Over 30 hours of French practice through classes, activities, guided discoveries and lunches, in a small-group setting, both in and out of the classroom
- 4 "language lunches" either in a local restaurant (dish of the day or similar plus a dessert) or in a cookery class (preparing and then sharing the meal!) accompanied by a French teacher
- 1 day excursion to Avignon, by train, to visit the Popes' Palace and other museums / sites in Avignon and enjoy a restaurant "language lunch" together

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Practical information

The cost and organisation to and from Arles for the programme is not included in our language programme. Here is some practical information to help you to organise your stay.

Transportation to and from Arles

By Plane: The closest airports to Arles are:

- **Nîmes-Alès-Camargue-Cévennes Airport (FNI)**
 - **Distance to Arles:** About 25 km (30 minutes by car).
 - **International Connections:** This airport offers a limited selection of flights mainly from European cities.
 - **Getting to Arles:** From the airport, you can take a taxi or rent a car to get to Arles.

- **Marseille Provence Airport (MRS)**
 - **Distance to Arles:** About 75 km (1 hour by car).
 - **International Connections:** Marseille Provence Airport is a major hub for both international and domestic flights, with connections to cities across Europe, North Africa, and beyond.
 - **Getting to Arles:** You can take a shuttle bus to the nearest train station (Vitrolles-aéroport) and then a direct train takes you to Arles (about 1 hour), rent a car, or take a taxi from the airport to Arles.

- **Montpellier Méditerranée Airport (MPL)**
 - **Distance to Arles:** About 100 km (1 hour 15 minutes by car).
 - **International Connections:** This airport serves destinations across Europe.
 - **Getting to Arles:** From the airport, take a taxi or rent a car to reach Arles.

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By Train:

Arles is well-connected by train, making it easy to travel by rail from other major cities in France and Europe.

- **From Paris to Avignon:**
 - You can take a **TGV (high-speed train)** from **Paris Gare de Lyon** to **Avignon TGV** (2 hours 30 minutes approx). From the Avignon TGV station, a shuttle will take you to Avignon Centre, from where you can take a train to Arles.
- **From Marseille to Arles:**
 - Trains from **Marseille Saint-Charles** station to **Arles** run frequently, with the journey taking just under **1 hour**. This is one of the most common routes.

Arles' **train station** is located just a short walk from the city center, making it easy to get to your accommodation upon arrival.

By Car:

Arles is accessible by car from a variety of international locations, and driving gives you the flexibility to explore the surrounding area.

- **From Paris:**
 - The drive takes about 7 hours via the **A7 motorway**, which connects Paris to the south of France.
- **From Marseille:**
 - The drive takes about **1 hour** via the **A54 motorway**.
- **From Montpellier:**
 - The drive from Montpellier to Arles takes about **1 hour** via the **A9 motorway**.

Once you arrive in Arles, there are several parking options available near the town center, but be mindful of restricted zones in the historic parts of the city.

Local Transportation: Arles is a small town and is best explored on foot.

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Accommodations
